
the seriousness of the time we are living through. We may yet feel it necessary to close. For the time being our services remain the same. If in any doubt contact the Church Wardens.



This year's Week of Prayer for Christian Unity has been prepared by the Monastic Community of Grandchamp in Switzerland. The theme, "Abide in my love and you shall bear much fruit", is based on John 15:1-17 and expresses Grandchamp Community's vocation to prayer, reconciliation and unity in the Church and the human family.

For 2021, the sisters are inviting churches across the world to enter into their tradition of prayer and silence that is rooted in the ancient traditions of the Church catholic.

Today the community has 50 sisters, spanning different generations, Church traditions, countries and continents. In their diversity the sisters are a living parable of communion.

Each year Christian Aid provides the 'Week of Prayer for Christian Unity' with 'Go and Do' action points for each of the daily reflections – linking into the important work of Christian Aid in the relief of poverty and advocacy of justice.



NEWS FROM THE FRIENDS OF REDCAR CEMETERY

In December 2020 The Friends of Redcar
Cemetery dressed the Christmas tree in the
middle section of the cemetery, although this
year we could not have the carol service around
the tree as too many people would not be able
to be safe with social distancing. We left a



message tin and encouraged people to come in their own time and write a message and place it on the tree. Sue, our Deputy Chair, made some Covid health care dolls wearing masks to put on the tree, including a thank you message to all who are caring for our loved ones. We had many comments that it lifted people's spirits, and it was nice to see the lights and messages. We have a crib near the tree which was given to us by Judy, who has passed now, and we are grateful to her family for the gift and we will use it every year. We hope in 2021 we will be back to normal with our carol service and Christmas tea.

We had a lovely surprise when Rachel the Manager of Tesco and Jackie the Community Champion came to the cemetery and brought us all presents. It was a kind thought and we appreciated being remembered.



Mary has carried out a lot of work at the baby memorial where 150 babies are buried in unmarked graves from 1940-1970s. We had erected this memorial in 2007 and people are now able to pay their respects to loved ones lost. A Christmas wreath was laid this year in remembrance of all those buried in this quiet place.

We finished our last working session just before Lockdown 3 started and cleared a lot of dead wood from the old section. Our men had worked hard collecting leaves and spade edging the many paths which makes the cemetery look much tidier. The Pay Back Scheme is working now in the cemetery and is continuing on with the work. Thank you to them they are making a good job of it.

We have lost two volunteers, Janet and Phil Philo, who have moved away from the area to be nearer their family. We are sorry to lose them as they had many talents, but what is more important they were very willing to share them with us and make the group what it is today.

As we go into 2021 things seem still uncertain; however, we are hopeful to continue on with our work. We are keeping in touch on Friends of Redcar Cemetery facebook page for the time being. We are now looking to the future as we have so many dedicated friends who give a lot of time and thought to making a difference to such a special place.


