

The Vicar Writes...



If you're taking a walk, consider prayer walking!


Prayer walking is a type of intercessory prayer that involves walking to or near a particular place while praying. As you prayer walk, your prayers extend beyond your own concerns, focusing directly on the needs of others and opening yourself to see them with God's eyes and heart.

Prayer walks are a means of asking God to give you a heart for your neighbourhood, city and land. It gives you a concrete means of doing something for the well-being of your town as you ask the Holy Spirit to pray through you as you observe the world around you.

Although the Bible doesn't specifically mention prayer walking, there are a number of examples of something like it in the Scriptures.

- God commanded the Israelites to march seven days around the city of Jericho, lifting up prayers and praises to God for His deliverance (Joshua 6).
- Jesus spent much time walking with His disciples throughout the land of Israel and prayer was most likely a part of those walks as Jesus observed his environment, prayed and then taught. In one scene, Jesus looks over the city of Jerusalem from the Mount of Olives and is moved to pray for the city (Matthew 23: 37-39).
- It was in walking through the city of Athens that the apostle Paul was moved by the Spirit to preach the Gospel in this idol-filled place. (Acts 17:6)
- The prophet Jeremiah was told to pray for Babylon, "And seek the peace of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the Lord on its behalf; for in its peace, you will have peace." (Jeremiah 29:7)

Before you head out for a prayer-walk, ask God to give you insight into what other people's needs might be as you walk by their homes. Then just go for your normal walk. Your heart will be moved to pray for the things you see during the walk.

For example, you might come across a garden that is extremely untidy and rundown. This might prompt you to pray for the health, both physical and spiritual, of the residents who live there.

Or, as you walk past a home you could ask God to bring the people who live there to know and love Him. Ask that their children and their descendants will all become believers.

If you walk around schools, you might want to pray for the teachers and the students, for their safety and peace, that they will al learn more about God, and for the schemes of the devil in their school to be thwarted.

You could pray for shops and businesses, for kids hanging around in the streets, homelessness on the streets of our parish, care homes, parks, holiday makers.

And of course, our church and other churches, that people may be drawn to living a God filled life.

You'll think of many other things to pray for as you go! You might even let your neighbours know you'll be praying for them as you walk by and ask them if they have any prayer requests. Your prayers could be the beginning of a neighbourhood revival!

Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you. (1 Thessalonians 5:17-18)

If you have done a prayer walk, please colour it in on the map in church. Let's try to cover every street in the parish with prayer.







A Love Letter from God

My beautiful child, whom I love so much...

You may not know Me well, but I know everything about you (*Psalm 139:1*). I know when you sit down and when you stand up (*Psalm 139:2*); I know what you do and when you do it. I am familiar with all of your ways (*Psalm 139:3*) — every hair on your head is numbered (*Matthew 10:29-31*). You were made perfectly in My image (*Genesis 1:27*), My offspring (*Acts 17:28*), a child of the Most High God (*Galatians 3:26*) and heir to the throne (*Romans 8:17*). I knew you and loved you before your conception (*Jeremiah 1:4-5*), and chose you when I planned creation (*Ephesians 1:11 -12*). You were never a mistake (*Psalm 139:15-16*) as all your days are written in the Book of Life (*Psalm 139:1516*).

Lorraine and I have just visited Leicester to visit "The King In The Car Park ", King Richard the Third.


We also visited Rothley Court, which use to be Rothley Temple, a chapel and manor of the Knights Templars.

The RAF memorial is two thirds complete. We now have the base to clean and renew the lettering on the stone. We hope it is finished by the anniversary of D Day, although the weather may delay its finish. We were looking at the back of the memorial at the headstones that we have been able to refurbish with the sale of the 'Aces High' book by John Watson about the WW1 Redcar Air Station.



Some of those headstone surrounds want tidying now, especially the grave of Revd. Edgar Greenshield who brought Christianity to the Inuit people, as inscribed on the headstone. Thank you for your donations and support in this work.

Not all is well at the cemetery though, as the grass cutting and weed suppressing in the grave spaces and paved areas has not been attended to. This, we think, is a change to the management of this service and we are waiting to hear plans for this. We do apologise but sadly, it does affect our work.

Our new work is to sort out the notice board in the new section. We may need a new one. We are getting estimates for this work.

We also want to refurbish the little marble seat in the Precious Garden at the Peter Pan area. We plan to renew the angel with a white outline and the bear in a brown outline. You can hardly see the outline of them now.



Forcem will be at the Armed Forces Day on June 29th in Redcar High Street.

We hope the weather has settled down by then. We have a couple of Friends with a van and car on transport. Two market stalls will be ready and waiting for our bric a brac, books, puzzles, a train set and many other items plus a tombola. We hope you will be able to support our stall.
