St Peter's Lent course will be using 'Not a Tame Lion', a course based on the life


and writings of C. S. Lewis. The first session will be on **Thursday**, **2nd March**, **starting at 7.00pm**. The course will run for five weeks.

READER'S RAMBLING

What's in a name?

Redcar, the town we love, and as I have pointed out many times, THE CENTRE OF THE UNIVERSE! Well, how did it get its name? Good question, - I'll have a stab at that, so here goes.

The Red bit of Redcar comes from Anglo Saxon/ Old English and either means Red or Reed. The Car bit of Redcar comes from Carr, double 'R':

meaning: bog or fen, marsh, where scrub/willow has become established. It comes from Old Norse. So we get Redcar, the red marsh or the reed marsh.

Now Chris, why are you going on about the way Redcar got its name? Well, I am glad you asked.

Very recently, I watched a TV programme looking at events from the Bible viewed through modern methods of Science, translation and archaeology.

One such event was Moses parting the Red Sea.

You may be ahead of me here, but recent developments in translation have led to an understanding that the Red Sea may be, more likely, the Reed Sea.

This has been identified as being a lake in Northern Egypt, Lake Manzala.

Known as the Reed Sea prior to becoming Manzala.

It's all down to how you read Yam-Suf, a bit like Red-Carr or Reed-Carr.

Back in 1882, a Major General of the British Army was employed by Lake Manzala and he wrote of an event he witnessed, the lake was there when he went to bed and the next day the wind had moved all the water away beyond his view.

Worth looking up - Major General Sir Alexander B. Tullock.

Archaeology in Egypt has turned up ancient inscriptions referring to the 'Shasu of Yahweh'. Shasu meaning Nomads, and Yahweh is the name of God used in the Hebrew scriptures. A name not to be over used, or used lightly.

There are Egyptian references to these people being in the North East of Egypt, in an area which relates to Goshen in the Bible. This area is where Joseph's family came to live, Joseph of the amazing coat fame. Goshen is near to Lake Manzala. As for Shasu, it's an easy word for me to remember as it sounds the same as Char Siu, which is Chinese BBQ Pork, one of my favourites, with noodles, with anything really. NICE!

It's interesting how as Christians we sort of don't need proof of the events from the Bible because we have faith, and yet it really feels rather good when it comes along, whether it's for ourselves or others. History, Archaeology and science are all there to help us understand ourselves, our past and where we are going to, and the world we live in.

Now add FAITH to those three and I believe we have Pilgrimage (2023 has been dedicated as the year of Pilgrimage).

And for me, that ties in so tightly with what Lent is.

Lent is there to help us understand ourselves, our past and where we are going to, and the world we live in, with and through our FAITH.

This month sees a couple of the National Patron Saint's days.

1st March is St. David's Day, patron saint of Wales

17th March is St. Patrick's Day, patron saint of Ireland.

Well, if you are Welsh, then David may well be Dafydd, Dai or Dewi to you.

And if you are Irish, then Patrick may well be Padraig.

If you're wondering what Peter is in Welsh, it's Pedr, and in Irish it's Peader.

The saints of our faith come in two sorts, male and female and, whatever nationality we profess, they are our brothers and sisters, human beings, flesh and blood the same as us.

I wonder how we see Jesus.

I wonder what we call him.

Have a think on that through Lent see how you feel about Him on EASTER morning.

Here is a word: **Tetragrammaton** (Gosh it's all Greek to me! Possibly Latin ????)

You may or may not know that at the last PCC meeting held in January I informed the members that I would be retiring from Reader Ministry after Holy Week.

Please may I thank you all for the guidance and support you have given me over the last 20years. I really and truly could not have done it without you.

I will still worship with my brothers and sisters at St. Peter's, I could I not, it's home!

Most of this will be sent to support the 2023 MU Make a Mothers' Day Appeal, and some for a different use, eg sponsoring a MU AFIA family holiday. This year the 'Make A Mother's Day' campaign is entitled 'Buying a Gift of Perseverance', giving desperately needed support to women families and communities in Burundi, where civil war has left deep scars, and where poverty is a daily reality or Uganda where MU is responding to the growing threat of gender-based violence by creating safe spaces where survivors can meet and be supported through their traumas. 
BIRTHDAY GIRLS!


